





Transition Tasks




Students of the Month








Virtual Choir

Interim Reports

The end of this busy half term also brings the first of the interim reports for Year 7 students. These provide an overview of how students have settled in to their academic studies (including new subjects!) for both students and parents/carers. Students are given a grade from 1-5 for their effort, behaviour and homework in each subject studied. Further detail about the criteria for each grade will be outlined alongside the report. An overview, however, is the following.

- 1 = Excellent
- 2 = Good
- 3 = Satisfactory
- 4 = Variable
- 5 = Poor

These reports represent a useful tool moving forward to help students focus and will hopefully lead to many positive and reflective conversations both at home and at school. You could help support your child by discussing the report with them during the half term break.

Homework and Class Charts

The students have done extremely well to manage the increased demand in homework that comes with attending secondary school. We're still encouraging students to write down all the homework they're given in their planners as well as checking Class Charts on an evening to check they have completed all pieces of work set. We're asking for parental support with this too. If any parent has not logged in to Class Charts, half term would be an ideal time to do so to get used to the layout and help support your child. Just helping them get into good routines will ensure they develop independent skills needed for life. A big thank you for this.

Half Term Challenge!

Each half term there will be a challenge which will take on a different theme. We are encouraging as many Year 7 students to get involved in this as possible. It is an opportunity for them to go beyond the classroom and stretch their creative abilities. The challenges will be directed specifically at students to get them learning and engaged in wider aspects of the curriculum.
