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Broadly the same proportion of students achieve a **Grade 7** and above as the proportion that historically achieved a grade A and above.


Grade 5 is awarded to the top third of students gaining the equivalent of a grade C or bottom third of a grade B.

The Department for Education has determined that **Grade 5** is a '**strong pass' and Grade 4** is a '**standard pass'**

The bottom of **Grade 1** is aligned with the bottom of grade G

The Curriculum

Core Subjects taken by all students

- * English Language
- * English Literature
- * Maths
- * Science (two/three GCSEs)
- * Religious Studies
- * Core PE[#]
- * Personal Development #

Core Subjects - Science

Science

- * There are two different pathways in Science.
- Some students (probably 3 groups) will be studying Triple Science and will receive separate GCSEs in Biology, Chemistry and Physics.
- All other students will be studying Dual Science. This route gives students two GCSE grades.
- Students will sit either higher tier (grades 9-4 available) or foundation tier (grades 5-1 available).
- These courses are assessed by linear examinations at the end of Year

Core Subjects

* Religious Studies

All students will study the GCSE Short course qualification (worth half a GCSE) as part of the core curriculum. Students can choose to study the full course qualification within the options.





Optional Subjects

- * Students choose four options to study in Year 10 and 11.
- * The majority of the subjects we offer are GCSEs
- Alternative Level 2 qualifications are offered in Enterprise Business, Sport, Health and Social Care, Engineering and Imedia
- We offer a Level 1 qualification through our Foundation Learning Programme.
- * French and Spanish are the only optional subjects to offer foundation/higher tier papers.





Assessment

- * Some subjects are assessed only by linear examinations at the end of Year 11 (e.g. History, Geography).
- Some subjects include a proportion of the course that is assessed by coursework or controlled assessment (called NEA – non examined assessment). The proportion of this varies across subjects – please see the options booklet for further information.
- * All GCSE subjects will be assessed on the 9-1 scale.





The English Baccalaureate ("EBacc")

- The set of subjects that keep young people's options open for further study and future careers. These subjects are:
- English Language/English Literature
- Maths
- Science
- A Modern Foreign Language
- A Humanity (History or Geography)





Curriculum Breadth and Balance

We very strongly recommend that most students aim for this in their choices. To achieve this, students should select:

* A foreign language (French or Spanish)

* A humanity (History or Geography)





EBacc Choices

 Students CAN choose both Modern Foreign Languages or both Humanities if they would like to do so.

How to Choose?

- Read the details about the subjects in the options booklet
- Which subjects does your son/daughter actually ENJOY studying?
- Which are the subjects in which s/he achieves well?
- Does s/he want to study something new?
- What are his/her future higher education or career aspirations? (does s/he already know what path s/he is likely to want to take?)
- What STYLE of learning and assessment does s/he like? (exams, coursework, project-based, practical etc.)
- DON'T let your son/daughter base his/her choices upon what his/her friends are going to choose!





The Free Choice Form

- Students must choose a total of four subjects
- We very strongly recommend that they choose at least one language and at least one humanity.
- They can only choose one DT subject (including Engineering)
- They can not pick both Sport (Level 2) and GCSE PE
- They can not pick both GCSE Business and Enterprise (Level 2).
- Further details on the completion of the free choice forms will be sent home on 10th February.
- These will shape our option blocks and our final option form
