Getting Involved








End of Year Tests

Students will be sitting some end of year tests in both Science and Maths when they return after half term. The Science test will be in the first two weeks back and the Maths in the week commencing 21st June. These tests are nothing to be afraid of and we don't want to cause any unnecessary stress, however, it's important that parents know about them to assist with preparation. The tests but will be assessing students on content they've learnt throughout the year so it might be a good idea to look back and review the work they've done. Key Stage 3 Science revision guides are available from school for £3 and Key Stage 3 maths workbooks can be bought from many online stores. In addition, other subjects will continue to complete their end of topic assessments so there is still lots to focus on and prepare for when we return after half term.

In order to assist this process, students will be shown some tips for revision during form time this week. If students do have any questions about this, they should speak to their individual subject teacher to find out more.
