

Examinations Summer 2024 What we do know...

- Outcomes in 2024 will be similar to those in 2023 and 2019
- Exams can cover any topic within the specification
- In summer 2023, students were given some additional formulae for Maths and Science. This is unlikely to be the case in 2024. Students must learn these formulae!



Examinations Summer 2024 What we do know...

- GCSEs planned to run between Thursday 9th
 May and Wednesday 19th June
- Contingency day 26th June students must be available on this day



Examinations Summer 2024 What we do know...

- There will be contingency arrangements in the event that exams do not run in Summer 2024
- This will not be used to support grading for individual students who are unable to sit the exams
- This will involve using mock exam results to support grading



Mock Exams

- Two sets of mock exams
- Set 1: 20th November to 1st December
- Set 2: 19th February to 1st March
- Each student will be given their own statement of entry for these exams
- This will say time and venue of each of their exam and give their seat number. These will be given out in form periods. Stick it on the fridge and ask students to take a picture of it!
- A text will be sent home to inform parents when these are issued
- When not in exams, students will follow their usual timetable.



The Exam Rooms

- Students must not take phones or watches into the exam rooms
- Pencil cases must be see through
- Students can take water into the exam rooms
- Students should bring their own equipment to the exams
- Students must be in full, correct uniform for all exams.



Unwell Students

- Where a student is unwell we will try to make arrangements for them to complete the exam that they have missed on their return to school
- Where a student is absent for an extended period, we will re-schedule their exams so that they can complete them on their return to school
- In some cases it will not be possible for them to complete all the exams that they have missed. We will prioritise them being able to complete at least one exam in each subject.

Mock Examination Results

- Issued by class teachers
- Use the outcomes and the targets to identify what needs to be improved
- Sent home on reports in January
- Mock results help to decide upon post-16 courses but look at predicted grades closely as well.



Non Examined Assessment (NEA)

- Music, Drama, Art, PE, DT, Textiles all include an element of NEA within the assessment
- Proportion varies by subject
- The work must be the students' own
- Deadlines set by department but all NEA should be completed by Easter
- Process of marking, standardising and moderating takes place in school before marks are submitted to exam boards







The purpose of progress reviews is to encourage students to reflect on their academic progress throughout the year, recognising areas of strength and identifying areas of weakness. The aim is to develop students' independence and self-monitoring skills.

The role of the form tutor is to encourage thoughtful reflection.



There will be three Progress Reviews throughout this year, each following the issuing of students' reports.

Autumn term	Spring Term	Summer Term
Interim reports	Mid-year reports	End-of-year report

Students' reports will be issued on a Friday. They will be digital reports, received by parents via email and/or the SIMS parent app.

The following week, one form period will take place in a computer room. Your Head of Year will let you know which day.

In this session, students will have the opportunity to see their reports and to complete a reflection activity.



In the computer room, students will need to log on to the computer and:

- 1. Log into the SIMS student app (via desktop) where they can view their report.
- 2. Access Class Charts to access a message from Rachel containing a link to an e-form which will form the basis of their reflection activity.

The link and message will be sent on the Monday morning before the progress reviews are due to take place.

Please note that students will be able to download a SIMS Student app to their phones, but phones should <u>not</u> be used in the Progress Review session.



Students will answer a series of questions which encourage them to reflect on their report.

When the forms are completed, and students have selected an activity to complete, the results will be used to:

- create a sticker for students to stick on the relevant book. This will alert teachers to the fact that a students has identified their subject as an area for development and the action the student intends to take in order to improve.
- create a spreadsheet so that form tutors can see an overview of their form's targets
- communicate to curriculum leaders the number of students seeking support with their subject and the main reason they feel they are struggling. This information could be used to inform departmental intervention, as appropriate.



Progress reviews 2 and 3 will include a review of students' progress towards their targets.

Disadvantaged students:

We will continue to support disadvantaged students by arranging face-to-face meetings to discuss their progress and involving parents in this process. In the first instance, they should complete the reflection activity with the rest of their form.
