



Thursday 16th October saw the year group take part in the visits to places of worship in Leeds.

YEAR 8

It has been a busy start for the Year 8 team and what a fantastic start they have had!

A mix of form time competitions, alternative curriculum day, assemblies from external providers such as Nestle and much more.

This term, Year 8 students have taken on all these activities, showing creativity, teamwork, and self reflection in equal measure. Year 8 continue to become role models for the younger year group and take responsibility for their behaviour for learning!

Year 9 have made a great start to this year & have already amassed almost 30 thousand positive comments! Out continuing vision is "Be the best you can be . . ."


We shared this with class teachers at the beginning of term we are working hard to live up to it in everything we do, especially the listen to instructions and engage with the task elements of our do's & don'ts





Year 13 Blencathra Fieldtrip

At the end of September, 47 x Year 13 geographers had a great time on the Blencathra fieldtrip in the Lake District.

They had three days developing fieldwork skills to help them with their NEA (coursework project).

On the first day they compared the features of a woodland with a grassland by measuring infiltration, carbon content and soil texture.

On the second day they went to the coast and recorded the impact of groynes on beach sediment.

On the final day they carried out a variety of surveys to assess the re-branding strategy of Keswick as the adventure capital of the UK.

In amongst this, Mr Hickling led the students on a voluntary night walk from Blencathra where students were fortunate enough to have a great view of the night sky.

In addition to setting the students up well for their NEA and reinforcing their geographical knowledge, such a residential trip developed the students' personal skills such as individual responsibility, team work and empathy.




COMPUTING

We are thrilled to share that planning permission has officially been approved for the development of a new **3G pitch** at our school!


This has been a long but rewarding journey, involving close collaboration with **City of York Council**, the **Football Foundation**, and two fantastic **partner football clubs**.




York's Aesthetica Film Festival is taking place from the 5th to 9th November offering a vibrant programme designed to inspire children of all ages through film, creativity and play.


